#### PIR Overview

What is a PIR and what is its purpose?

- Statutory obligation (every five years)
- Assess the regulations as they currently operate and whether the intended objectives are being achieved
- Allows stakeholders the opportunity to suggest areas of improvement

What is the PIR process?

- Neutral review (nothing ruled in or out at this stage)
- Not a White Paper or set of specific proposals for change
- Stakeholder survey questions
- Analysis of responses
- Report to be published by January 2022

What can stakeholders expect beyond this PIR?

#### Context for this PIR exercise and RIR


RIR = Transposition of Interoperability Directives when UK was a Member State (largely reflects the EU processes) Purpose of Interoperability Directives – harmonised process = lower cost/economies of scale, and greater connectivity (?) RIR post EU exit –smooth transition, with some changes (NTSNs/NTRs) New opportunities/initiatives: Rail Reform/Rail Project Speed The Fourth Railway Package (changes to roles/processes) International Services and ensuring continuity UK's Obligations under COTIF as a signatory (bites on international services)

- ➤ How to make use of new flexibilities in RIR now? (only recently in force since 1 January)
- What are stakeholders most interested in (wide range of people, parts of the industry impacted)?
- ➤ Is there a consensus or split views on what is needed?
- ➤ Role of RIR in setting and applying standards, role of industry, role of individual projects?
- ➤ Efficient Delivery of Rail Projects what does that look like and what is the role of regulations?
