




#### Rewards & incentives

- The reward mechanism is broken, rail will never recover until train operators (TOCs) are incentivised to grow their business.
- Whatever your views about privatisation, the fact is the TOCs provided significantly more trains and doubled the number of users in about 20 years.
- We now have a regime where the operators (except passenger open access and freight, of course) are paid regardless of whether they collect fares or offer a service that attracts customers. The incentives to improve the bottom line are minimal.



#### So What Has Gone Wrong?

- The Department for Transport (DfT) and the Treasury do not understand the railway cost model.
- Micro-management of inputs and outputs. There seems to be an obsession with cost reduction instead of bottom line optimisation.
- The product offering is simply not attractive to many in a post covid world. People have choices, particularly in the world of work.
- There is a failure to see the new world as an opportunity, rather than a problem, if the Monday to Friday peak never comes back this could result in a much greener and more cost effective railway.





#### What Do We Do About It?

- This cannot wait for Great British Railways (GBR) to be created, I am not even sure if GBR will address this issue anyway.
- We need to devolve bottom line responsibility to as low a level as possible. This must include not just TOC revenue and costs but also Network Rail revenue and costs. The present situation is producing bizarre anti customer consequences.
- We need true accountability for railway managers (including sacking those who don't perform) and get the DfT out of day to day decision making on Britain's railways.
- If you always do what you've always done.....

















