RAIL CAMPAIGNERS WELCOME NEWS ON FARES INCREASE

Rail campaigners have welcomed news that the Chancellor won't be imposing inflation busting fare increases on rail passengers. "It's a welcome early Christmas present for rail travellers in England" said Jerry Alderson, vice chairman of *Railfuture*. "The government has recognised the vital role that the railways play in sustaining the economy of this country and realises that it would have been counter-productive to price people off the railway."

"Nonetheless, we still have some of the most expensive fares in Europe, and these rises will be ahead of inflation. Few people will be enjoying inflation busting income" he said.

"Rail use has continued to grow despite the recession so it's important to keep investment going" said Jerry "If this government is to live up to its claim of being the greenest government ever, then it must make rail attractive. That means affordable fares and enough capacity for all the business on offer."

"There is also the question of what happens in subsequent years. Will the government abandon the planned increases at 3% above inflation for 2013 and 2014?"
