It was the first opportunity to display our new banner promoting Hoo Peninsula Railway; designer Alix Gunn.

Boo – Hoo!

As if tempting fate, the first public outing for the banner was followed within days by the project being officially 'paused'! Medway Council's website now says: "In the light of consultation, high inflation, significantly increased construction costs and pressures on public spending, the council is proposing to pause its plans to create a new railway station and train service on the Hoo Peninsula. Instead, it is currently exploring the potential for alternative transport options to improve access for residents travelling on and off the peninsula. The preferred option being considered is to improve local bus services to provide better and regular connections into areas across Medway. The planned road investment, doubling the number of road routes on and off the peninsula, and environmental improvements have widespread public support and remain part of the council's vision to support sustainable communities on the Hoo Peninsula."

Since the early-March edition of *inter-railse* no.57, Railfuture's London and South East regional branch members have, amongst their various other activities:

~ participated in the alternate-monthly meetings of the Uckfield Railway Line Parishes Committee and of the Brighton Transport Partnership.

~ participated in the Southeastern Stakeholder Forum.

~ joined regular meetings of our Sussex & Coastway (twice), Herts & Beds, and Eastern divisions – the first of the former in the new community hub at Bishopstone station, the latter three all online.

Also in March, regional branch committee members:

~ held a regular meeting online of the L&SE regional branch committee, with thoughts turning to organising our own AGM in April and the national AGM and award presentations which we're hosting in mid-July.

~ participated in an evidence session of the All-Party Parliamentary Group for the South East following our response to their Call for Evidence for their second Inquiry, related to the role of Transport Infrastructure.

~ made submissions to the Planning Inspectorate on a site at Ringmer which is of vital interest to us for a potential new Uckfield-Lewes rail link and is the subject of two appeals on the same site against refusals of planning permission for either 75 or 200 new homes.
