NORTHERN TIMETABLE WOES: Timetable nightmares overshadowed the first weeks of the new Northern franchise- on many levels. As watchdogs for the line, we have alerted Northern to each of these. We are pleased to report the new management are listening and taking action to address these where this is possible within present rolling stock and staffing constraints.

Firstly, the new services Arriva agreed to provide when they signed the franchise are likely to be so seriously delayed by late delivery of new rolling stock and electrification schemes that the Department for Transport are redrafting the Invitation to Tender. We therefore endeavoured to obtain a commitment this will not impact the promises made for improved Cumbrian Coast services from December 2017 including the 8 through Manchester trains each way and Sunday services north of Barrow.

Secondly, the interim shortage of rolling stock continues to erode the existing timetable with through Manchester services either reduced or downgraded to Sprinter stock meaning loss of seat reservations, reduced comfort and more changing trains at Lancaster or Preston.
