



Best Campaign – Gold Award

Hastings & Rother Rail Users' Alliance

Comprises six local RUGs, including four affiliated to Railfuture.

Alliance negotiated with GTR an innovative timetable solution – 'The Eastbourne Overlap' – to the proposed split of the through Brighton-Ashford hourly 2-car diesel service at Hastings in May. The replacement 4-car electric from Brighton runs to Hastings as planned, but the 2-car diesel from Ashford continues west of Hastings to Eastbourne [hence 'overlap'] thereby increasing the previous 3tph service between Eastbourne and Hastings, via Bexhill, to 4tph.
