 - Bi-directional signalling at Bedlington





The Northumberland Line

Northumberland Line Extensions

- Morpeth-Choppington-Bedlington
 - ⁻ Via existing freight tracks
- Ashington-Woodhorn-Newbiggin
 - ⁻ Needs ½ mile new track on existing track bed
- Additional Station at Seghill
 - ⁻ Always part of SENRUG's original campaign
- Ashington Butterwell
 - ⁻ Needs new North to East junction at Butterwell
 - ⁻ Provides diversionary freight route
 - ⁻ Option for passenger trains Ashington to Alnmouth
- Ashington Cambois North Blyth
 - ⁻ Suitable for Very Light Rail / battery power + rapid charge
 - ⁻ Use bay platform at Ashington once NL extended to Ashington

Blyth Town Centre – Airport

- Blyth Town Centre to Newsham North Jct
 - Trains run under battery or DC electrics
 - Possible rapid charge facility at Blyth TC stn
- Newsham North to Northumberland Park
 - Trains run under battery power (5.9 miles)
 - New station at Seghill
- Northumberland Park to Airport
 - Trains run on DC electric (Metro standard)
 - New interconnection station at Benton East for ECML
 - Faster access to airport from north Northumberland
 - No physical rail connection with ECML
- Campaign Leaflet now available


Newcastle – Morpeth – Berwick Local Service

- Hourly local service between Newcastle and Berwick, calling at all stations
- New stations at Belford and Beal
- Feasibility Study completed: proposal is
- technically possible and commercially viable
- Electric trains needed with higher speeds and faster acceleration
- Helps revitalise Northumberland's northern communities and support tourism and leisure
- The most beautiful railway line in the country amazing coastal views – but currently no local trains running on it
