

**DIRECTIONS:** From the station, walk along the approach road, turn left and then right at the White Hart pub along the High Street. When this bears right, follow it and you will see the spire of the church among trees to your left. This is about ten minutes' walk.

**TRAIN SERVICES:** Trains depart London St Pancras at 8.00 and 8.30, departing Kettering (for connections from the north) at 09.31 to reach Corby at 09.40. Trains return to Kettering at 16.43, 17.43 and 18.43.

**BUS SERVICES:** The X4 bus stops at the church and at Corby rail station. It operates between Milton Keynes-Northampton-Kettering-Corby-Oundle-Peterborough and the bus stops outside St John's Church (both sides of Oakley Road, which is a dual carriageway). Ask the driver for this stop as it is not listed in the X4 timetable but is a recognised stop for this service. It leaves bay 15 at Peterborough Queensgate Bus Station (200 meters from the rail station) at 07.40, 09.10 and 10.10 and takes just over 40 minutes for the journey. Return buses leave Corby at 17.19, 18.24 and 19.24.

The X4 also leaves Kettering Newland Street at 15 and 45 minutes past each hour and takes 25 minutes to reach the church.

The Corbystar 5 and 5A serves the station approximately every 15 minutes each way to the Town Centre and the ASDA superstore. This service is useful for any delegates who have arrived in Corby town centre on the X1 raillink bus from Kettering station. The 5 and 5A continue into Corby Old village after/before Corby station. Delegates are advised to alight at the Cardigan Arms pub, which is five minutes walk from the venue.

For local bus times call Traveline 0871 200 22 33 At Corby station there is a real time bus timetable screen. There is a taxi rank outside the station and the journey time to the venue is about five minutes in a cab. There are also two local taxi companies: 01536 202020 and 01536 443322.

**REFRESHMENTS**: Loco Coco is the new coffee bar at Corby station and welcomes Railfuture delegates. A great choice of hot drinks and snacks are available from 6am to 6pm.

HARRINGWORTH VIADUCT: On Sundays until 6<sup>th</sup> December, East Midlands Trains passenger services between Kettering and Leicester are being diverted via Corby and over Harringworth Viaduct, Britain's longest masonry viaduct that spans the Welland Valley. You may wish to stay the Saturday night and travel this route, in which case we advise you to stay in Kettering.
