Welcome to an early-autumn edition

We begin by looking at the implications for rail growth of housing growth at five locations across our area.



In mid-August the new Chancellor of the Exchequer [announced over £600 million](#) to support up to 50,000 new homes in five 'high-demand' areas in the South East, four in London and Bedfordshire and one in Essex, and all with rail development implications.

Meridian Water on West Anglia's Lea Valley line, where new half-hourly all-day every day services start on Monday 9 September, has funding for 'rail works'.

Beaulieu Park on the Great Eastern main line receives funding for a new rail station in Chelmsford.

New Bermondsey will be a new station name on the East London line Clapham Junction route in Lewisham.

Biggleswade station on the East Coast main line will see more passengers from c.3k new homes.

'**Tendring Colchester Borders Garden Community**' of 7500 new homes has NQ provision for any rail development. Railfuture abhors rail vacuums!

Meanwhile in Surrey Tandridge District has been granted £150k to develop plans for [South Godstone Garden Community](#) of around 4k new homes in the catchment of the station on the Redhill-Tonbridge line.

The message is clear: rail development must be closely aligned with economic development which in the south east of the country means housing growth. That is the rationale being followed with Railfuture's approach to fulfilling the desire for an **Uckfield-Lewes** rail link; it has to be linked to a [new garden community](#).

Our vision for rail: A railway system that provides services which travellers and freight forwarders want to use, and which offers more journey opportunities to more people and more freight.

What have we been doing out there?

Since the early-August edition no.14 Railfuture has:-

~ participated in a further meeting of CRPs in the TfSE area, reviewing July's Community Rail South East inaugural Showcase event at Southampton Harbour.

~ held a quarterly Kent Division meeting in Staplehurst.

~ participated in a second Network Rail stakeholders' workshop developing the [West Coastway Connectivity CMSP](#), for autumn public consultation.

~ supported colleagues in Lincolnshire branch on their stall at a conference about climate change.

~ published the monthly [Rail User Express](#) for August.

~ participated in the launch of the new Sevenoaks-Swanley [Darent Valley Community Rail Partnership](#).



~ supported the setting-up of a new rail user group for Plumstead and the two Woolwich stations, PAWRUG, with an inaugural open meeting on 2 September.

What will we be doing out there?

Railfuture already has a network of 'TOC liaisons', members of the national [Passenger Group](#) whose role is to cultivate working relations with the train operating companies. Under Chief Executive Andrew Haines Network Rail is changing to a network of **14 Routes**, giving our national [Infrastructure & Networks Group](#) the opening to develop a network of new NR liaisons. This London & South East branch covers 9 Routes and so has several opportunities to work more closely with NR.

Our vision for Railfuture: An independent organisation whose views are respected by the rail industry, to which decision makers come for advice, and which rail users are proud to join and recommend.
