

DIRECTIONS TO **ST MICHAEL'S CENTRE**, THE GREEN, STOKE GIFFORD, BRISTOL BS34 8PD

The venue is very close to **Bristol Parkway Station**. Allow 5 minutes walk from there.

Exit the station, and walk through the car park until you almost reach a 'T' junction. On your right is a blue sign marked "Stoke Gifford". Take this footpath which leads through the Churchyard and veers left round the church to reach a Green. The Church centre is ahead of you. Do not use the café entrance, which is the older part of the building, but instead walk past around the building where you find a small car park and the entrance to the main centre (North Road). There will be a reception desk by the door. The map and satellite image, below, from Google show where the venue is.
