COP26* postscript

Mind the gap between rhetoric and reality! Railfuture's message in the brief interval between Autumn Budget with 3-year Spending Review and the start of COP26 was this: one cut of domestic air passenger duty + an 11th annual freeze of fuel duty = government hypocrisy. Then for the conference's Transport Day our message was this: decarbonising transport requires mode shift to rail, and more electric rail, not simply electric cars.

In real life, outside the Whitehall bubble, Network Rail first highlighted "<u>four actions against climate change</u>" and then "nine things that happened during COP26."
