West Coastway – all change please!



GTR / Southern timetablers have turned their attention to the route which was the subject of a Network Rail connectivity study to which we contributed, in the era before the pandemic, during 2019-20. Network Rail's *West Sussex Connectivity Modular Strategic Study* was published during the pandemic in July 2020. Full details can be found in <u>Sussex & Coastway Division</u>.

The current consultation is about proposals reflecting the new post-pandemic world and which are intended for introduction with next year's summer timetable from Sunday 19th May. An all-too-familiar weakness, especially for a coastal area heavily reliant on its visitor economy, is the absence of any proposed changes to Sunday services, leaving visitors on weekend breaks with contrasting outward and return levels of service.

Our vision for Railfuture: An independent organisation whose views are respected by the rail industry, to which decision makers come for advice, which rail users are proud to join and recommend.


