**Innovation on Britain's railway**



Many of our speakers are from train operators. However, they run trains thanks to the work of companies like Track Access Services Limited (TAS) in Shepreth (just south of Cambridge) who make driver training possible and support renewal and enhancement schemes for many rail projects. TAS specialises in writing rail route simulators used in Britain and Ireland to train drivers, and also produces signal sighting systems, intended to ensure that signals can be seen by drivers in all conditions. David Reed will be giving a very different type of presentation and it should be fascinating. It's a great chance to see how the railways work from behind the scenes.

Followed by an update on East Anglia's railway and Railfuture's campaigns. The Hitchin Flyover opened in June. Construction on the Ipswich Chord is advanced. The planning application for Cambridge Science Park station has been submitted and on 16<sup>th</sup> July we hand in our 2,907-signature petition to reopen the Wisbech line. So much is happening.

## Directions to Chapelfields Chapel, Chapelfields Road, Norwich, NR2 1SD



From the station entrance, turn right to the no.25 bus stop in the forecourt. This takes you almost to the door of the chapel. Alight at the St. Stephen's Street bus stop (opposite Marks and Spencers') and walk forward a few metres to the subway, descend into it and walk diagonally to the right ascending into Chapel Fields Road. The Church is just in front of you. Enter via the left hand side door.

From the city centre, you can walk through to the rear of Chapelfields Shopping Centre to Chapel Field Road, cross the adjacent pedestrian crossing to the chapel.

With a one day 'Anglia' ranger, you can use the no.25 bus free of charge.
